The Novices 1940s

From 1941 to 1946 the 'Black Hand of War' led to the cancellation of the event for six long years and the Novices 25 was not held again until 1947. In January 1947 it was again decided to make the Novices 25 a second-class (or middle markers) event. The first Novices since the end of the war went ahead on 30 March 1947 and was won by A Hadfield of the Manchester Clarion in 1.09.36. The Withington Wheelers Journal records....

"The last Sunday in March, after a lapse of five years, saw the welcome revival of our Open 25 mile trial. This time it was decided to run the event as a second-class confined to riders who had not beaten 1:08:00 but retaining the Novice flavour by awarding a special prize for those competitors who had not previously beaten 'evens'.

Our fears that we would not obtain a full card proved unfounded, a total of 130 entries being received, of those the number who had not beaten evens was seventy and we shall have to consider whether next year's Open shall be promoted as a Second-class, Third-class or a purely Novices event.

We were favoured with decent weather. The morning was calm with just a trace of rain which gave promise of fast times. This was confirmed when John Smith, the first man, returned 1:11:45, a four minute improvement on his personal best. Lance Tulip, the Withington's main hope, did not disappoint and his excellent 1:10:50 was tenth fastest and gained him the Novice award. Later we found that he was also third in the handicap, moving up from fourth place when it was discovered that one apparent winner (through no fault of ours it should be added) had cut out a portion of the course. Our own members, mostly the new ones, returned quite creditable times and we look forward to some fast performances when they have had a little more experience of the racing game.

All in all we can definitely consider the event to have been a success. We give our very best thanks to good friend Arthur Wood who assisted Mac in manipulating the tickers and to all members who co-operated in ensuring the tricky course was checked and marshalled.

One feature of the trial which must go on record is that Lance Tulip was very lucky to finish at all. At the start his front tyre was not looking too good and he was able to effect a change and actually rode on Ken Perrin's front wheel, his own tyre blowing out later while in Ken's possession.

At the time of writing the exact method of sharing the prize money is still under dispute."

THE OPEN "25" Of course we got the full 100 permitted entries and also a few to spare and everything went off in first-class style, even though the event was a Second Class one.

At 8.01 a.m. on the morning of April 4th. Ken Perrins was despatched by the President to be followed by another 88 of the competitors; conditions were fairly favourable, in-so-far-as it did not rain and the wind did not reach gale force. Our own did not fare too well, Ken Rutter and E. G. Moore, D. N. S. Ken packed at 18 miles, the remainder performed as follows:-

The "NOVICES" The morning had dawned brightly but a chilly east wind promised to make the going hard for this year's hundred would-be speedmen. Promptly at 8 a.m. Arthur Wood sent off Karl - our Mac being busy in London at an R.T.T.C. National Committee meeting. Karl was out to surprise us, returning home with an excellent time of 1.10.36 only being caught by D. Buckley, Pyramid R.C. whose 1.9.38 eventually proved to be too good for the rest. Two others were to beat Karl's time, he having the hard luck to be relegated to fourth place by one second.

The Team Race was won by Abbotsford Park for the second year in succession their men finishing in 2nd, 8th and 9th places, the Clarion being second for the third year running. Altogether 36 men realised their first ambition of beating "evens". Arnold's third promotion was again highly successful with bags of marshals at each corner and Jim's usual efficient organisation at the finish drew the spectators away from the Timekeeper who was ably assisted by Bill Bailey - to both these watch-holders our thanks are due.

Open Novices' "25": The decision of the A.G.M. to accommodate 120 riders was fully justified when, after the first postal delivery on closing date day, Arnold counted just 127 entry forms.

The start card gave quite an impression, containing such illustrious road-racing names as Salt, Haslam, (two of each of these and even a "J.J." of the former !). Ferris, Ellis and even a Harris, Honeysett and Thomas thrown in.

The day of the event dawned fine, but the bright sum and clear visibility gave little indication of the hard conditions to be encountered, and it was perhaps not surprising that the aformentioned did not all line up to the reputations of their namesakes, only one appearing in the final prize list ... he being R. Ferris of the M/cr Athletic & G.C. who filled fourth place with an excellent ride of 1.10.49.

Two other 1.10 rides occupied the second and third places, but it was D. McCreery of the M/or Whs. to whom the laurels went for a grand winning ride of 1.8.58.

Times at the turn (12m 5f) showed McGreery to have already established a lead of more than half a minute over everybody except club-mate H. Whitehouse who was then only 12 seconds in arrears but who gradually faded to finish in fifth negition.

of the five leaders at the finish it is interesting to note that four of them were at the lead of affairs at the
turn, the exception being Ferris who was no higher than sixteenth, but who rode the second-fastest "roturn" of all. Worthy of
mention, too, is the fact that these same four were riding in
their first time-trial and agin the exception, Ferris, had
clocked a 1.22.

Of our own riders, Les Skells was the only one inside "evens", this being good enough to place him 34th. in the general classification. Next came Brian Purcell in 55th. positionwith 1.16.35, closely followed by Allan McKonna at 58th. in 1.16.51 -- good rides for the day without dcubt. George Hardman just could not get moving and finished further still down the list.

A pleasing feature was the number of complete teams to finish (no less than 14) a figure which, I am sure, would put some of our Open event finishing sheets to shame. With riders in 2nd. 10th and 16th. places Leek C.G. were the winners in this keenly contested department. Manchester Whs., with an apparently commanding lead of 1st. and 5th. positions, had to go down to position 42 for their third man but, despite this, managed to take second-honours only 38 seconds behind Leek and exactly 2 minutes whead of the Pyramid in 3rd. position. Withington were placed 10th.

There were absent faces among the Checkers and Marshals due to illnesses and other reasons, and although we cannot be blumed for two riders who ran off the course, such happenings are usually avoided by the posting of spare men to odd corners. Unfortunately, this year, no spare members turned up at the start.
